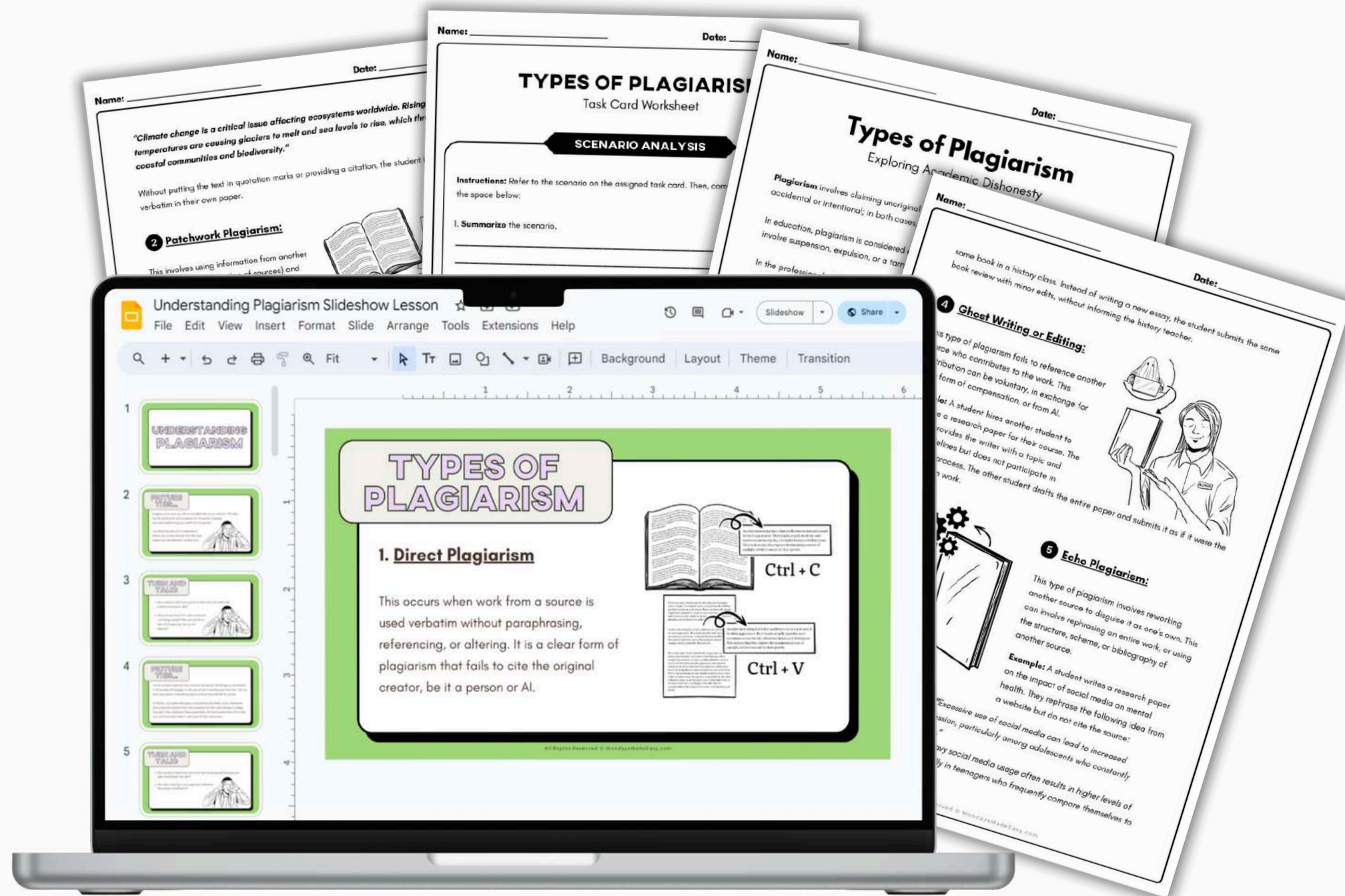

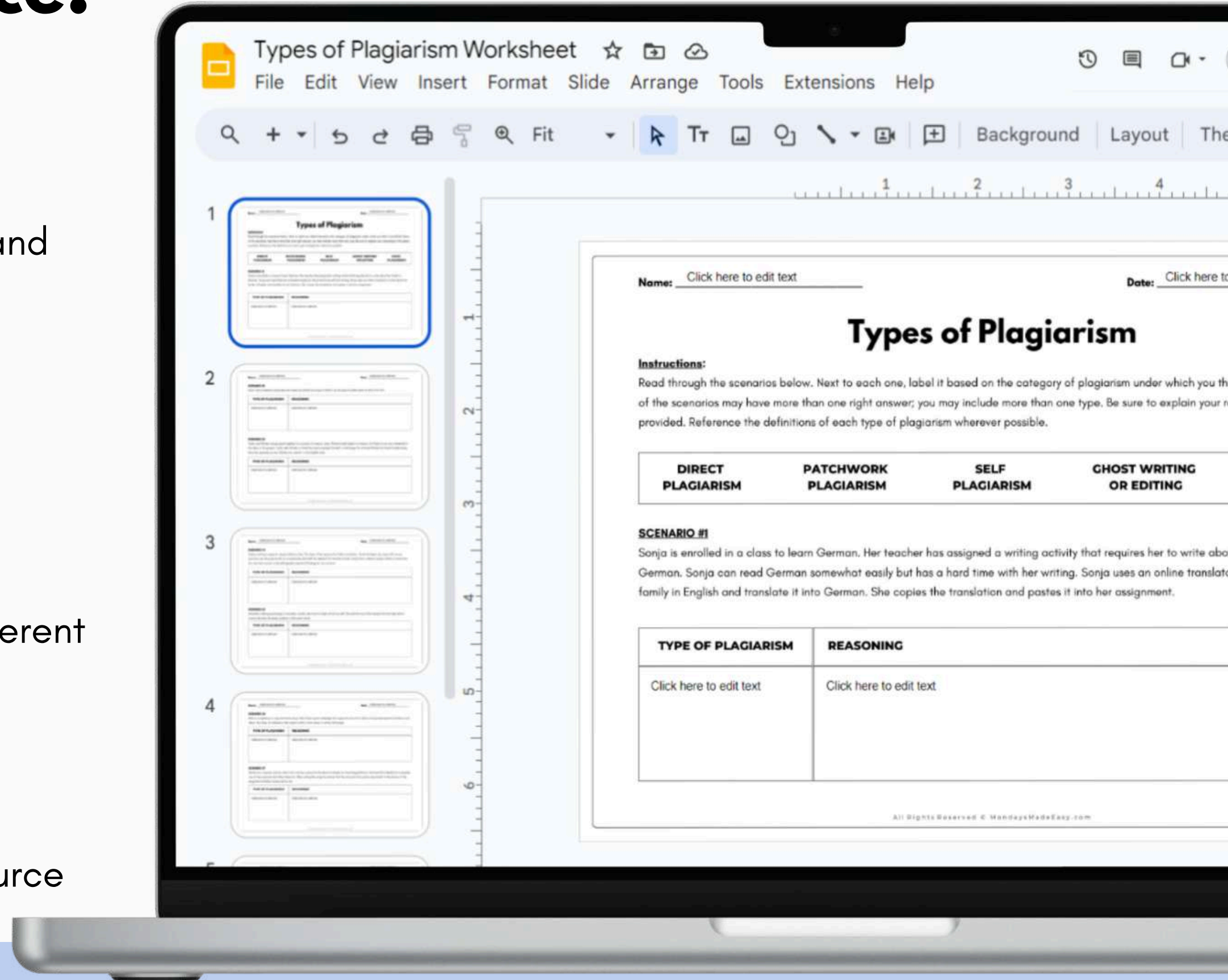

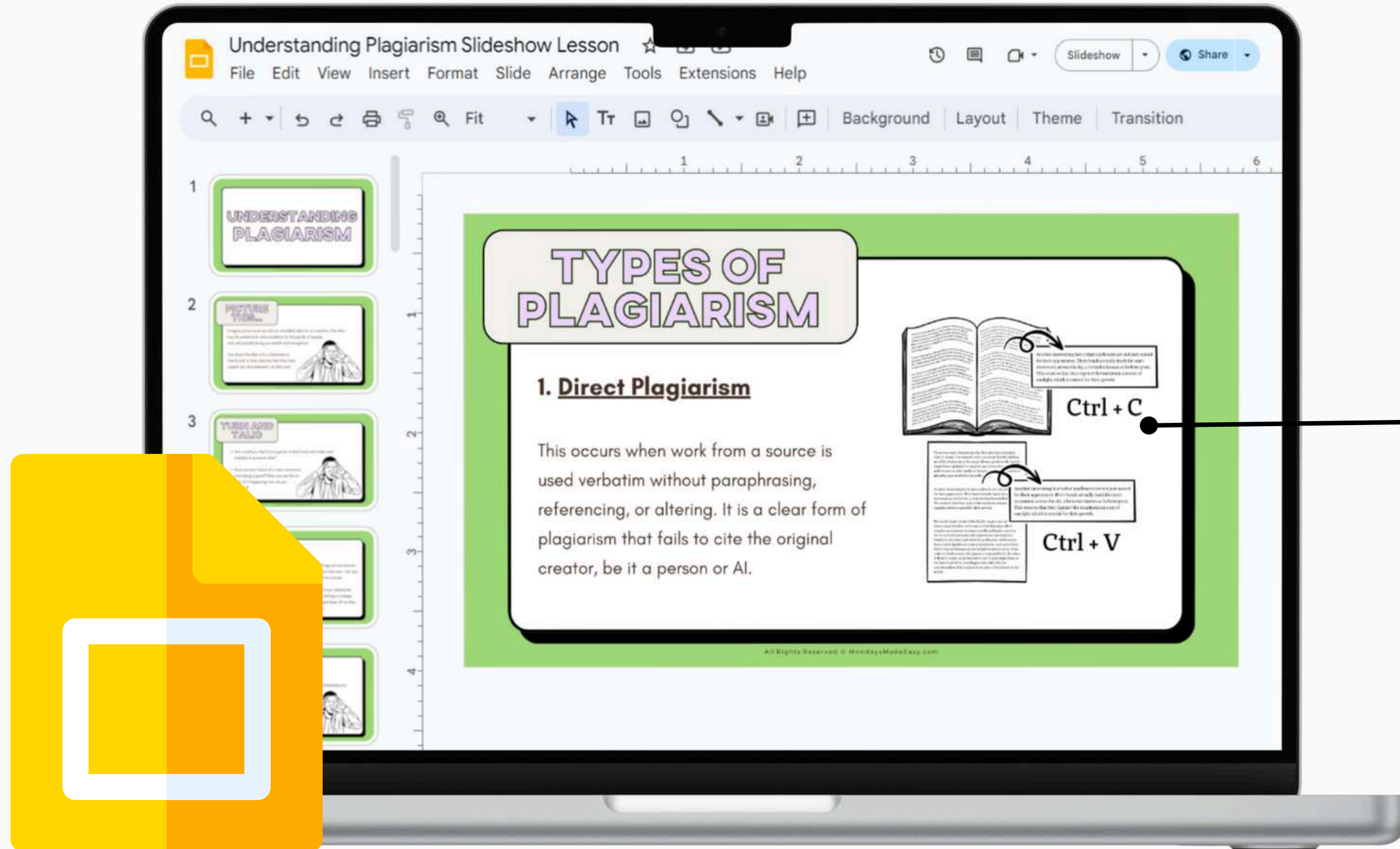

Types of Plagiarism

Exploring Academic Dishonesty

Plagiarism involves claiming unoriginal work or ideas as the author's own. Plagiarism can be accidental or intentional; in both cases, it is a serious offense with real consequences.

In education, plagiarism is considered **academic dishonesty**. The consequences can involve suspension, expulsion, or a tarnished academic record.

In the professional sphere, plagiarism is considered **stealing**. Your work and your ideas are your intellectual property. There can be legal and monetary consequences for people who plagiarize, especially if they violate copyright claims.

The 5 Types of Plagiarism

It is your responsibility to be aware of the different types of plagiarism so that you avoid them in your writing. Here are some categories that common acts of plagiarism fall under:

Ctrl + C

Ctrl + V

1 Direct Plagiarism:

This type of plagiarism occurs when work from a source is used verbatim without paraphrasing, referencing, or altering. It is a clear form of plagiarism that fails to cite the original creator, be it a person or AI.

Example: A student is writing a research paper on climate change and decides to use a passage from a published article. The student copies the following text directly from the article:
