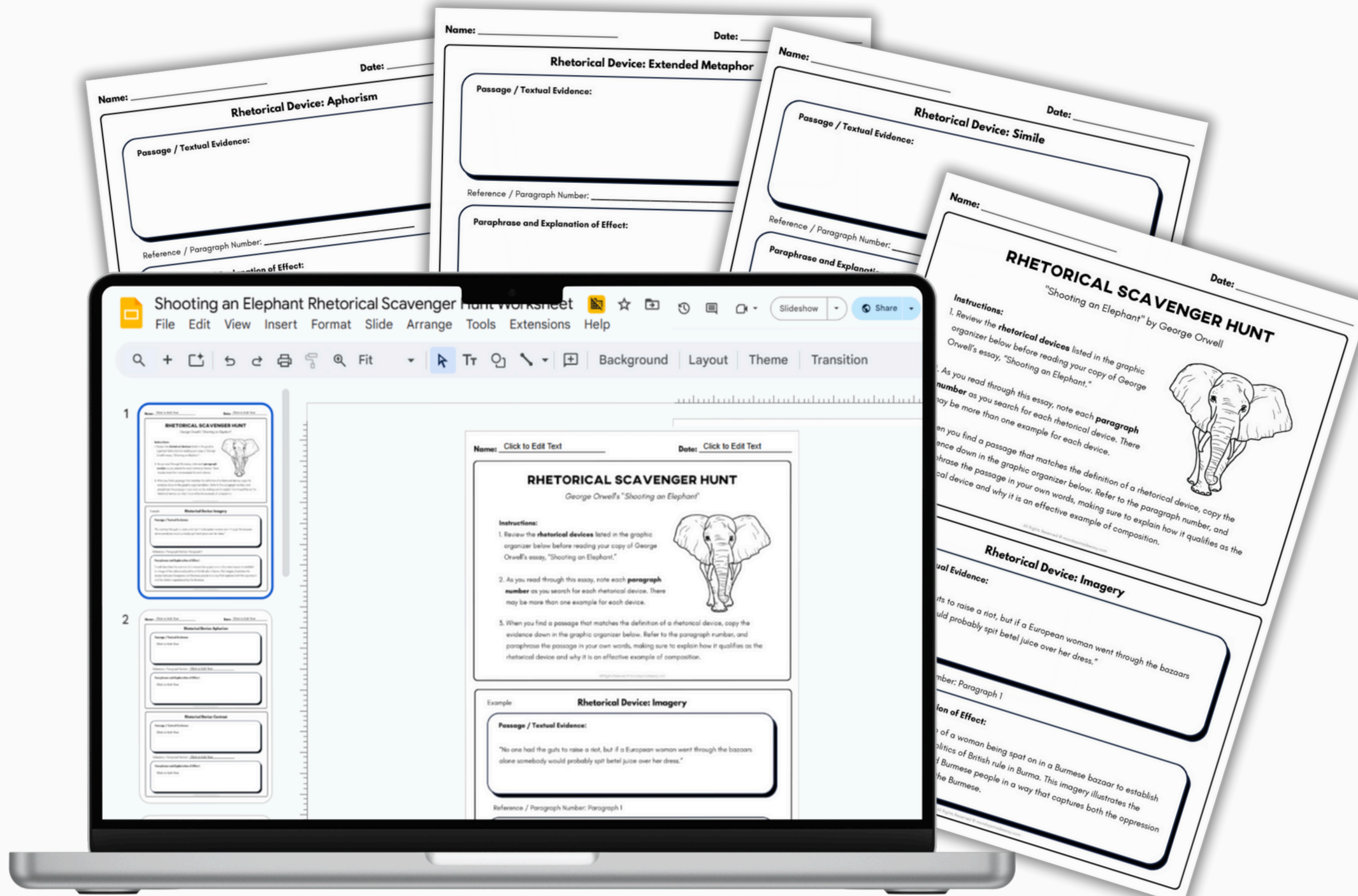


Rhetorical Device Scavenger Hunt

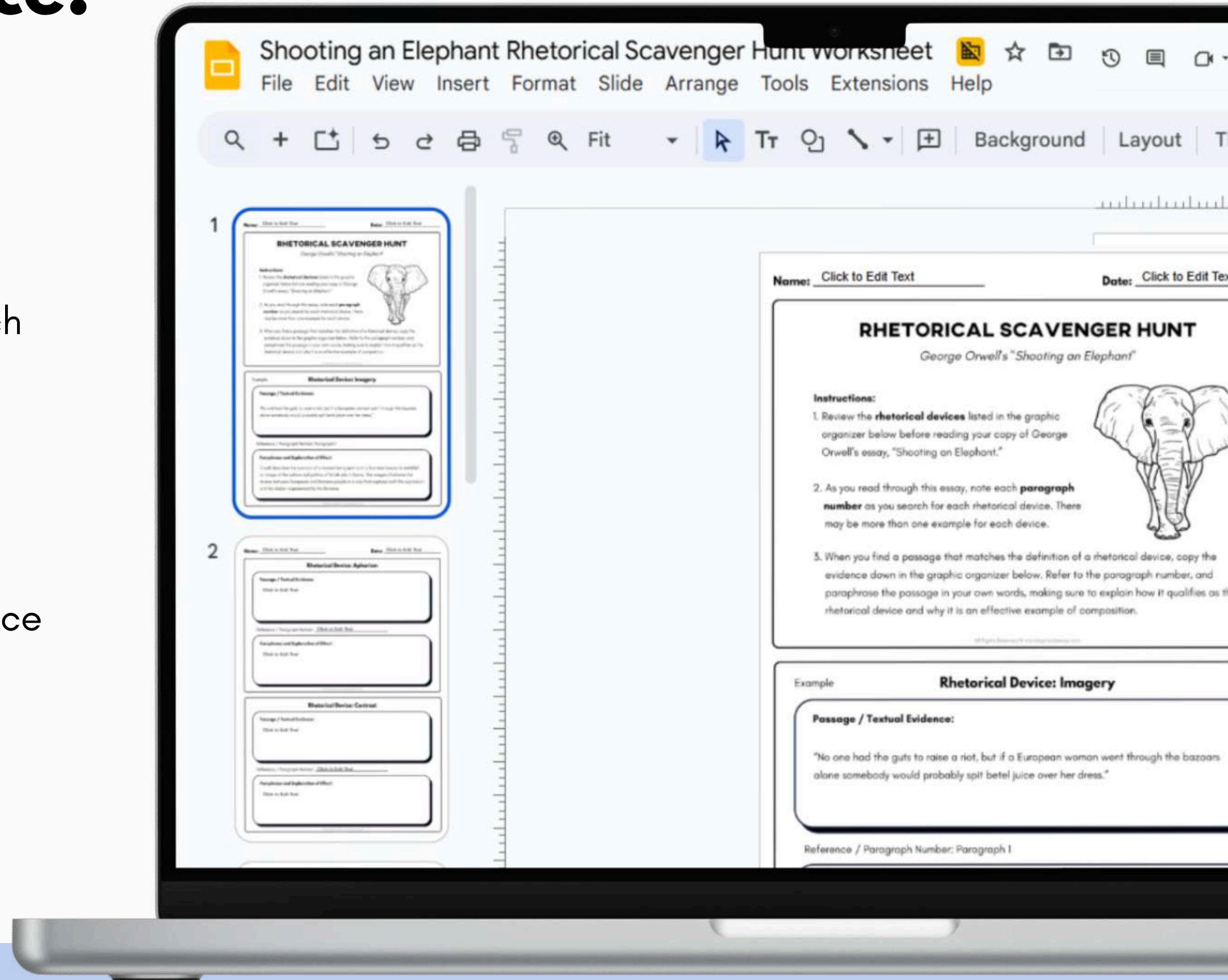
