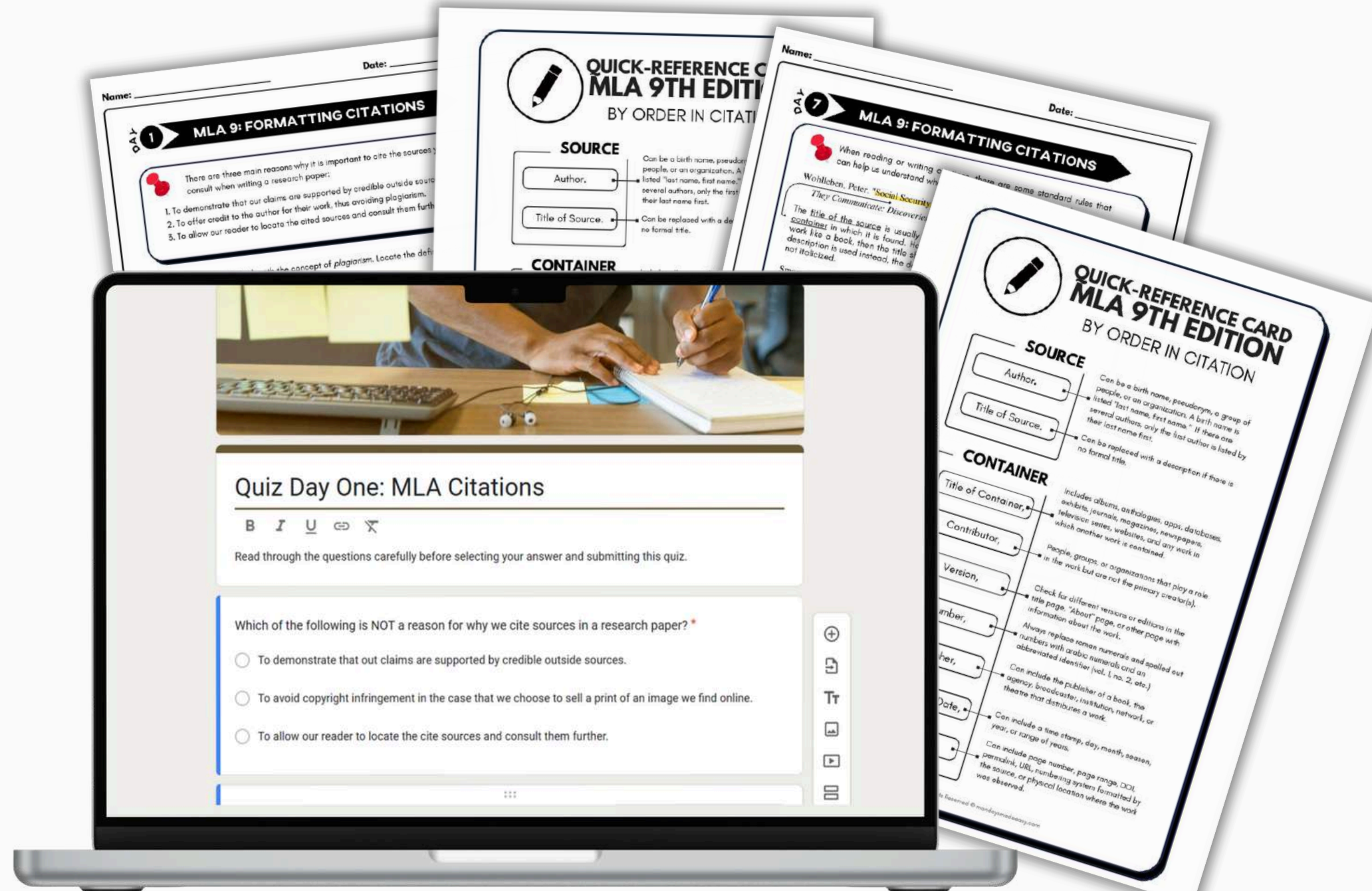

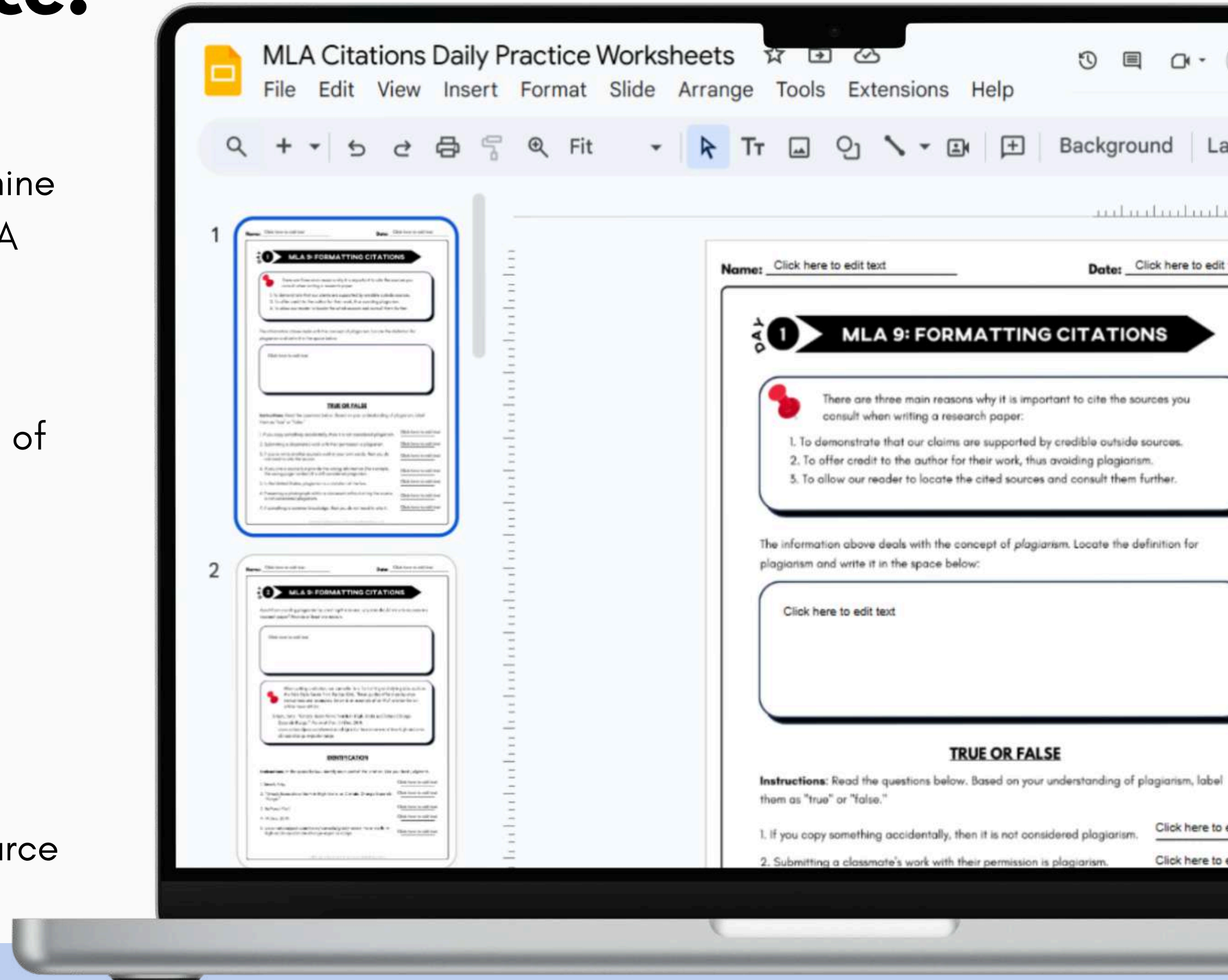

# Explore 20 Days of Spiraled Review

Using these activities, students will practice identifying errors, mastering basic citation rules, distinguishing between the components of a citation, and more!

**SOURCE**

Author. Can be a birth name, pseudonym, a group of people, or an organization. A birth name is listed "last name, first name." If there are several authors, only the first author is listed by their last name first.

Title of Source. Can be replaced with a description if there is no formal title.

**CONTAINER**

Title of Container. Includes albums, anthologies, apps, databases, exhibits, journals, magazines, newspapers, television series, websites, and any work in which another work is contained.

Contributor. People, groups, or organizations that play a role in the work but are not the primary creator(s).

Version. Check for different versions or editions in the title page, "About" page, or other page with information about the work.

Number. Always replace roman numerals and spelled out numbers with arabic numerals and an abbreviated identifier (vol. 1, no. 2, etc.)

Publisher. Can include the publisher of a book, the agency, broadcaster, institution, network, or theatre that distributes a work.

Publication Date. Can include a time stamp, day, month, year, or range of years.

Location. Can include page number, page range, permalink, URL, numbering system for the source, or physical location where the work was observed.

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
